Woman Appointed Supervisor

Mayor John F. Shelley yesterday appointed Attorney Dorothy vonBeroldingen, an attractive blonde divorcee who helped him become Mayor in 1963, to the Board of Supervisors.

He had previously appointed her to both the Civil Service Commission and the Economic Opportunity Council. She said she will resign from the Civil Service Commission, but she intends to hold her city job on the Economic Opportunity Council, where she serves as the voice of the Mayor.

VOTE

As a member of the Board of Supervisors, of course, she would vote on appropriations affecting the Economic Opportunity Council.

A native of Oak Park, Ill., Mrs. vonBeroldingen attended Northwestern University and the University of California at Berkeley. She worked as a sales promotion manager for Clarion Radio in Chicago and as an advertising manager for Schwabacher-Frey in San Francisco prior to her marriage to Linton vonBeroldingen, former managing editor of the San Francisco Examiner. They have a son, Paul, age 19.

She went back to school and received her law degree from the University of San Francisco in 1954. She had graduated from Berkeley in 1939.
