




Amador County was created on May 11, 1854. The meaning of this word in Spanish is "lover of inanimate objects". This county probably derived its name from either Sergeant Pedro Amador or from Jose Maria Amador, his son. Sergeant Pedro Amador was one of the prominent settlers of California. *
