Napa County was created on February 18, 1850 and was one of the original twenty-seven counties of the State of California. The word "Napa" means, in the language of a large and powerful tribe of Indians that lived in that section of California, "fish". The county was named because of the myriads of fish that inhabited the Napa River and other creeks of this section. *

Kean died in office in 1887. Meacham was Vice Assessor to Kean.
