San Luis Obispo County was created on February 18, 1850 and was one of the original twenty-seven counties of the State of California. On September 1, 1772, the Mission San Luis Obispo (Saint Louis the Bishop) was established and was named for Saint Louis, the Bishop of Toulouse. He was the son of Charles of Anjou, King of Naples, and the county derived its name from the mission, founded by the Padres, Junipero Serra and Jose Cavaller. \*

Francisco Ziba Branch and Don Jose de Jesus Peco were appointed Assessor by the Court of Sessions.

Charles Varian received 132 votes in the 1857 election. Cantua 116 votes, de la Guerra 16 votes, and Graves 1 vote.

B.P. Brown received 264 votes in the 1859 election. V. Gaxioca 111 votes and Charles Varian 2 votes.

N. Gaxioca received 184 votes in the 1861 election. James Dickson 171 votes, Horace Saunders 79 votes and J.J. Simler 21 votes.

John Bains received 257 votes in the 1865 election. W.C. Dana received 139 votes.

Zenobio Pico received 166 votes in the 1867 election. C. Mthers 157 votes and John Bains 99 votes.

James M. Buffum (D) received 467 votes in the 1869 election. Orson K. Smith (R) received 393.

John J. Scheiffarley (R) received 565 votes in the 1871 election. John Gaylord (D) received 521 votes.

John J. Scheiffarley (R) received 693 votes in the 1873 election. James Buffum (D) received 493.

John J. Scheiffarley (R) received 864 votes in the 1875 election. J.S. White (D) received 720 votes.

Angus McPherson Hardie (Union) received 1,054 votes in the 1879 election. J.M. Buffum (W & NC) received 912 votes.

Angus McPherson Hardie (R) received 988 votes in the 1882 election. P.A. Forrester (D) received 960 votes.
