Fred W. Birchmore died a month after he was appointed to office in 1935.

Gordon Gojkovich went on to serve on the Board of Supervisors from 1994 to 1998.

Solano County was created on February 18, 1850. This county is one of the original twenty-seven counties of the State of California. "Solano" in Spanish means "east wind", and was the second name of the celebrated missionary Francisco Solano. When the chief of the powerful tribe of Suisunes Indians, which inhabited the west side of the River Jesus Maria, was Christianized, he was baptized Solano, and his name was given to this county. *

Before receiving the name *Solano*, the chief was called *Semyeto*, which signifies "brave or fierce hand." At the request of General Mariano Vallejo, the county was named for Chief Solano, who at one time ruled over most of the land and tribes between the Petaluma Creek and the Sacramento River. ***
